### **KGA SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT OFFER**

This is part of the KGA bespoke support plan for each academy led by Debbie Anderson, Executive Headteacher for College Park Infants and Lyndhurst Junior School. In the last three months, the KGA Quality Assurance teams have carried a number of reviews in our academies.

We began with a one day review on Literacy in Ringmer. Next, we carried out a two day review, fortuitously two weeks before their OFSTED, in Lyndhurst Junior. Staff there commented as to how well this review prepared them for their OFSTED. These reviews have been followed by a two day review in Northern Parade Junior and a one day in Northern Parade Infants.

All these QA reviews have ben shared with the respective governing bodies together with the KGA Trustees.

## STAFF WELL BEING SURVEY

We took part in a national survey on well being and staff retention comparing us with 300 schools across 75 MATS.

In the words of the researcher some of these results are dramatic in a good way for Kings. 41% of our staff as opposed to 29% nationally are satisfied with their worklife balance – could be better I know but we are on the right track.

42% of our staff as opposed to 31% nationally think that school leadership in our MAT understand the workforce challenges.

80% of our staff as opposed to 63% nationally would recommend our schools as a good places to work and 90% as opposed to 69% would recommend our schools to parents.
